Professor Eric Chan is a pharmaceutical scientist in the Department of Pharmacy, National University of Singapore (2006-current). Eric is a Council Member of the International Society for the Study of Xenobiotics (ISSX) (2019-2021) and a Scientific Affairs Committee Member of the ISSX (2016-current). He is a platform lead under the Innovations in Food and Chemical Safety (IFCS) Programme at the Agency for Science, Technology and Research (A*STAR) (2018-2021), an affiliate member of the National University Cancer Institute, Singapore (NCIS) (2018-2021), an adjunct principal investigator at the Singapore Institute for Clinical Sciences (SICS) (2016-2020), and chair of department graduate committee (2018-current). He is an editorial advisory board member of the *Biochemical Pharmacology* (Elsevier, 2018-current), *Drug Metabolism and Disposition* (ASPET, 2019-current), *Journal of Chromatography B* (Elsevier, 2008-current) and *Asian Journal of the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning* (AJSOTL, 2018-2020). Eric was awarded the Dean's Chair Professorship in the Faculty of Science (2015-2018). He was five times a recipient of the Faculty of Science Teaching Excellence Award and four times the NUS Annual Teaching Excellence Award. Eric also received the Faculty of Science Young Scientist Award (2010) and Outstanding Scientist Award (2014). Eric was awarded the NUS Overseas Attachment Programme (OAP) and the National Medical Research Council (NMRC) research training fellowships at the Imperial College London (2008) and University of Washington (2012) respectively. Eric was Chair of the Department Safety Committee (2008-2011), Assistant Dean (Undergraduate Programme, 2011-2013), Vice Dean (Undergraduate Studies and Student Life, 2013-2014) and member of the Faculty Promotion and Tenure Committee (2016-2018). Eric served previously as the editorial board member for the *Journal of Proteome Research* (American Chemical Society, 2013-2016) and *Rapid Communications in Mass Spectrometry* (Wiley, 2006-2016).
